### Class news – Streams

Welcome back to school! Where did the holiday go?

We have fourteen new children in our class, and they have been working very hard already.

Our literacy learning has been based on a recount about our summer holidays. The children have talked about an aspect of their holiday and have written it, in the style of a recount. The children have thought about phrases that we could use to help to sequence our writing and used them in their writing. Next week we are going to be looking at traditional stories and in particular the story of the Enormous Turnip, which will lead into our Harvest Festival, later on this term.

In our maths learning we have been learning all about numbers and the properties of numbers. The children have been encouraged to count forwards and backwards, to use place value to solve problems. The children have had fun estimating amounts of things. During the next couple of weeks we will be learning about ordering numbers, and odd and even numbers.

Our theme learning for this half term is 'Funny Bones'. Within the theme we are going to learn about ourselves – our bodies and looking at healthy eating. During the next couple of weeks we are going to be thinking about our families and who is in our family. It would be great if you could send in photos of your child's family, which we could use as a writing prompt.

I am pleased to see that most of the children have brought in their PE kits for the start of term. If your child has not yet brought their PE kit in, could you please ensure that it comes into school and stays on their peg in the cloakroom. Also can I remind you to check that all of your children's clothes are named clearly.

Children in Year 1 and Year 2 will have brought their home learning packs home with them this week. The learning in the packs supports the learning that they are doing in the class. The packs do not need to be completed until the end of the term, but I would ask that you to encourage your child to complete at least one piece of learning a week, and then to bring it in to school so that I can go through it with your child.

### Class news - Rivers

We have had a great start to the new term. It has been lovely getting to know the new Year three children and catch up with the children who were in Rivers last year. In literacy, we are using the text The Star Bearer as a stimulus for our learning about myths over the next three weeks. We are getting to know the book this week and we will be writing our own myths at the end of the unit.

In maths we are concentrating on addition and subtraction for the next two weeks. We are learning and applying a range of mental calculation strategies. Key to this learning is being able to quickly recall pairs of numbers to make 10. I will be sticking a reference sheet of pairs that make ten in our homework books. It would be really helpful if you could support this learning at home by randomly calling out a single digit number and your child replying with the corresponding number to make 10. eg : I say 8 you say 2, I say 4 you say 6.

As I'm sure you know, we are learning about Ancient Egypt this term. Thanks to everyone who has already brought in books, photos and interesting artefacts for our theme display area. We have been learning about hieroglyphics and the importance of the Rosetta stone in decoding hieroglyphs. Next week we will be exploring the role of the Pharaoh, and finding out about Gods and Goddesses.

I will be sending out homework on Fridays, to be returned the following Wednesday. In addition to the weekly homework tasks I will also include a theme homework pack at the back of the book. This will contain a number of activities to be completed throughout the term. Generally these are more creative tasks that the whole family can enjoy completing together.
