



Dear Parents/Carers

I would like to say a HUGE thank you to all of the parents/carers and friends of the federation who supported our children so enthusiastically during our Harvest Festival period. In line with our school policy, shoes should be black and flat. I appreciate that occasionally it is not possible to adhere fully to our uniform policy, but I thank you in advance for helping us to maintain as higher standard as practically possible.

Class news – Streams

What a busy time we are all having in Streams. The children have been doing lots of learning and all been trying very hard.

In our literacy learning we are continuing to work on the story about The boy who cried Ninja - we have been exploring adjectives and how we could use them to make our writing more interesting. We have also been thinking about how to use speech marks appropriately and seeing where we can spot them in our reading books. We are going to be writing our own stories based on our book. When they are finished it would be great for you to come and read what the children have written.

This week in our maths, we have been exploring addition and subtraction. The Year 2s have been working on number bonds to 10 and seeing how this can help with our number bonds to 100. The year 1s have been looking at number bonds to 5,6,7,8 and 9 and using them to solve various problems. The Foundation children have been thinking about how they can combine different amounts to get a larger amount. We are going to be learning about doubling numbers and thinking about time – for the younger children sequencing days of the week and months of the year and the older children will be learning about clocks.

Our theme learning is promoting a lot of interest for the children. They have enjoyed finding out about

bones and making skeletons this week. They have been thinking about various parts of the body and learning about what the parts are for. We are going to be continuing to find out about our senses and to do lots of scientific experiments to help us to find out about how they work.

We had a super afternoon out walking up Hollerday Hill looking for signs of Autumn. Luckily we went before the rain set in!! The children were very observant and we were even fortunate to see a squirrel chasing amongst the trees!

Thank you to all of you who supported your children at our Harvest service, it was lovely to see so many of you at church, and the children enjoyed sharing their songs with you. Don't forget to sign up for parents evening!

Class news – Rivers

In literacy we have now completed our own myths and will be shortly publishing some on the school website. Next we are moving on to writing instructions which we will link to our theme learning. In maths we are exploring time. Thanks to those of you who helped your children research why we have leap years. The children have been telling the time using both digital and analogue clocks and we are now calculating time intervals, using timetables and real life problems.

In science the children used their knowledge of levers to make their own shaduf (A simple machine which Ancient Egyptians used to lift water out of the river Nile.) The children worked in groups to design and make their machine which we then tested. See website for more information.

PE lessons are now on Thursday and Friday. This is because Mr. O'Sullivan, PE teacher from Ilfracombe Arts Academy, will be joining us on Thursdays. Please make sure that your child has the appropriate kit in school for these days.

Class news - Oceans

Instructions have been wrapped up and we are now extending our non-fiction abilities by writing our own explanation texts. Through this sequence we will investigate how the pyramids were built, as we break-down the stages of building a paragraph and develop our writing stamina. Our journey through explanation texts will also lead us to identify the differences between instructions, explanations and recounts as we examine the specific use of words that typify each genre.

In maths we are exploring the dimensions of the great pyramid using length, weight and capacity. We will try to build our own model pyramid and develop our understanding of sizes through using objects around the school. Much of our work will involve problem solving as we deepen our ability to estimate quantities and sizes. Our first challenge is to work out how many reams of paper it would take to build a tower as tall as the great pyramid (146m).

Beam house is only a week away and I am sure we are all looking forward to our adventures during the PGL holiday.

Free Schools Meals eligibility

We would like to let you know, that you may be entitled to claim free schools meals, If you are in receipt of Income Support, Income based Jobseekers Allowance, Support under Part VI of the

Immigration and Asylum Act 1999. Employment and Support Allowance (income-related), Guarantee element of State Pension Credit or Child Tax Credit (without Working Tax Credit) with an annual income below £16,190 a year.

Although the KS1 children are currently entitled to free meals under the new Government Scheme, should any KS1 children be eligible under the above criteria, we would ask that you also please speak to your School regarding the completion of a Pupil Premium Eligibility form, if you have not previously completed one, as again, additional funding is also received by the school for those children eligible. Any forms that have recently been returned to your school have been forwarded onto the School Meals Team.

It may be that you do not wish to take up any eligibility you may have for free meals, but we would encourage you to apply, because each child registered brings in additional funding to the School. If you think you are entitled to free school meals, whether your children are in KS1 or KS2, please let your school know, so that we can arrange to let you have the relevant claim form/s. Please be aware that no-one in the class, apart from the class teacher will be aware your child is having free school meals, so your children will not be made to feel different, if you claim.
