Dear Parents/Carers

I hope that you all had a wonderful Easter break and managed to enjoy some quality family time. We were certainly lucky with the weather, especially given how early Easter was, and the children have very much returned to school full of the joys of Spring!

FEDERATION REVELS

The federation is tentatively thinking about hold a 'Revels' Day at Parracombe on Friday 27^{th} May. This would include may-pole dancing and a cream tea and is our attempt at keeping the Revels tradition alive and well within our community. The day would also mark the end of our Science Week so will inevitably include our 'Family Challenge'. ATTENDANCE

Well done to everyone for helping to ensure that our attendance across the federation continues to improve. At the end of last term, we achieved 96.3% at Lynton, 97.1% at Kentisbury and 96.9% at Parracombe; a vast improvement upon this time last year. The two-week half-term break in the Autumn term certainly seems to have reduced the level of illness normally experienced at the end of the Autumn and beginning of the Spring term and hopefully this will be replicated next year. Next year the additional week of holiday will be after the normal half-term break to ensure an even number of weeks within each half term. It is anticipated that families wishing to benefit from a slightly cheaper holiday will be able to make use of this additional week as authorisation of term-time holiday is now only permissible in exceptional circumstances. Terms dates for next year have been circulated but further copies can be obtained for the school office.

USE OF SOCIAL MEDIA

Could I please remind you that the federation provides guidelines on the parental use of social media. This has been previously circulated and is also available on our website and from our school offices. It is imperative that these guidelines are adhered to and that users of social media such as Facebook bear in mind that even comments made between 'friends' can end up in the public domain. In particular, the naming of children directly or through association or posting images of children who attend the federation without parental consent is not acceptable. Nor is posting comments which may place children at risk of harm or which could be deemed to be cyber-bullying. I very much hope that, in the interests of the safety of all of our children, I can rely upon all parents/carers to follow our guidelines.

SWIMMING

Towards the end of the summer term, every child within the federation will undertake an intensive swimming programme. The sessions will be held at West Buckland swimming pool and be run by Aquarius Swim School. Further details regarding these sessions will be sent home shortly. It is very important that the questions regarding your child's swimming ability are answered accurately in order that all of the children are placed within the appropriate swimming groups. We will also have use of the sports hall at West Buckland and whilst not swimming or changing, Sophie Hill will be running PE sessions to enable our children to enjoy the high quality facilities available. There will be no charge for these sessions as the cost of them is being met by the PE and Sport Premium Funding, a legacy from the 2012 Olympic Games.

Class news - Rivers

Rivers class are very enthusiastic about this term's theme. We are on our way to Rio and getting ready for the Olympic Games 2016. We're going via other countries and Europe (including Russia, France and Greece) to learn about trade links, language, the Greek's influence on our country and finding out about food supply to our shops and supermarkets, both locally and further afield. We'll also study healthy lifestyles and diet. We're particularly looking at Fair Trade and the principles behind helping farmers and other industry in other countries get a fair deal for their work and products.

We are focusing on spelling and grammar for a couple of weeks in literacy before writing persuasive letters to convert people to buying Fair Trade (we hope!). We've been using a variety of calculation methods to solve addition and subtraction problems and how rounding and estimation can help us to check our answers in maths.

We have a busy time ahead and lots to fit in before the end of the school year, but the children are already showing a real interest in their learning and what lies ahead.

Class news - Oceans

We are focussing on a sequence about myths and exploring the passive voice in order to add emphasis to our writing. We are enjoying it so far and looking forward to writing our own myths in various styles. Through this sequence we will explore modern day versions as well as those from ancient Greece. We will also be recapping

In maths we are consolidating our knowledge of multiplication whilst finding the areas of regular and irregular shapes. Later on we will be applying this knowledge to find out dimensions from areas and volumes of 3D objects. This will be linked to a brief look at Archimedes and moments of "Eureka".

SATs are on the week commencing the 9th of May and this year we are taking a new style of test. We are preparing well and do not need to be overly concerned about them at all. We are starting to plan the SATs breakfasts and really looking forward to getting it all over with. After then we are going to have lots of

adventures! On our return from half-term, we will be perfecting our acting and singing talents, as the cast of "Charlie and the Chocolate Factory", our summer production this year.

How you can help at home:

Literacy – We need to practice converting verbs from present to past and future tenses.

Reading - When reading with children, ask them their opinions or what they think the character's opinions of an event are. Challenge them to explain or give proof to back-up their opinions through the text. Proving inferred meaning is a key skill that is tested.

Maths - We need to practice converting distances, weights, time and capacities. Please take opportunities to ask children how many m in a Km, how many g in a Kg, etc.

Class news - Oaks

The children have come back to school refreshed and reenergised ready to learn, after the Easter break. This an important term for Year 6 especially, as it is their last term before moving onto secondary school. They will soon start passing down their responsibilities and teaching their peers how to be good role models within the federation.

Our new theme is 'Road to Rio', looking at; global connections, Ancient Greece (origin of the Olympics), North and South America (in more detail Brazil), the Olympics and healthy lifestyles through diet and exercise. The home-learning tasks were sent out last week, the core task will complement a project the children will be working on in school. Over the coming weeks, children will be researching the Rio Carnival and as part of the creative curriculum will be designing and making their own costume to wear to our very own Rio Carnival. As part of the project children will be collecting recycled goods which they could use to form part of their costume.

This week we had a visit from the North Devon orthodontists, who shared their knowledge about healthy eating, looking after our teeth and needing braces in later life. They also taught the children about the effect sugar has on our teeth and which foods and drinks we should only consume in moderation due to high sugar content. This reiterates the children's learning from the previous week and sugar in our diets and making sensible choices. We also looked at healthier alternatives and made our own 'wholemeal pitta pizza faces!'





If any parents or members of the community think they can provide a valuable learning experience to the children, which is related to our summer theme please get in touch.

As part of healthy eating, we will be starting to grow our own fruit and vegetables in the school garden which when harvested we intend to cook a healthy meal. If you have any seeds or bulbs for donation they would be very gratefully accepted.

In literacy, we are focusing on 'Greek Myths', the children will be planning, writing, editing and sharing their own version of a Greek myth. You can support your child by researching Greek myths, gods and goddess' and cities within Greece.

In maths, we will be focusing on multiplication and division, revising methods previously learnt and applying it to a context through problem solving. You can support your child by learning time's table facts and the related division facts at home.

Finally, now the weather is improving it is vital that all children have a labelled water bottle and sun hat in school at all times.

On the 24th April 2016 I will be running this year's London marathon. That's over 26 miles! I'm raising money for a charity that's especially close to my heart 'Breast cancer now'. Less than a year ago, in my second year of uni, I was diagnosed with breast cancer. Unless you've been there yourself you have no idea of how this diagnosis changes you as a person. Your entire outlook on life changes. I was 32. I had

no choice but to have a total left sided mastectomy. Not only did I go through diagnosis and surgery as a single mum, I also continued on my nursing degree at the same time. I have yet to have my second operation in the summer to have my right breast removed. Some of you know me well enough to realise that cancer does not frighten me! I flatly refuse to let it win. My early diagnosis and surgery meant that I have survived cancer not once but twice! And best of all I will be around a long time yet to spend quality years with my two children. Other people aren't so lucky. Every 45 minutes another woman dies from breast cancer. So in the time it takes you to do your weekly shop at Tesco that's at least 2 lives lost! We can do something about

this. Help me to raise money for 'Breast cancer now'. I'll do the hard part; I'll run every single mile (dressed as super woman no less).
