
GLOBAL WAVE OF PRAYER

Class news – Rivers

In English we are focusing on narrative and writing an adventure story. We have been reading 'The Secret of Black Rock' and the children have been continuing to write their own versions of the story. The children will have the opportunity to design their own front covers for their stories after half term. In maths, we are focusing on fractions. The children have been finding fractions of amounts and we will be moving onto equivalence this week. We have started Magic Maths this week, so the children will have the opportunity to earn certificates when they learn their timetables. The certificates will be presented in celebration assembly each week.

This week we are starting our topic on the Lynmouth Flood disaster. The children will be acting as historians and evaluating sources of evidence to try and work out what happened.

Year 5 have had their last forest school session last week and year 6 will be having their sessions after half-term.
