CHRISTINGLE

All of our children have thoroughly enjoyed their trip to Lynton Cinema this week. Key Stage Two watched Swallow and Amazons, whilst Key Stage One were treated to Sing. I would like to take this opportunity to thank Bill Prior for hosting the Festival – it was such a lovely experience for everyone.

WATCH YOUR SPEED

I have noticed that some parents/carers are driving rather quickly along the narrow roads approaching Parracombe and Kentisbury Schools and within the vicinity of Lynton School. Although you are permitted to drive up to 30 miles per hour along these roads, I urge you to cut your speed to no more than 20 miles per hour in order to ensure the safety of our children. Thank you for helping us to keep your children safe.

PADDLING, SNORKELLING & DIVING



Have you heard your child talking about Paddling, Snorkelling and Diving at home and wondered what on earth they're talking about? If so, let me try and explain. The National Curriculum puts great emphasis upon children showing mastery within their learning, rather than simply rushing off ahead as soon as they have purportedly understood something. As a staff, we have grappled with how best to explain this to the children and, having explored a number of ideas and strategies, we have settled upon Paddling, Snorkelling & Diving! If a child is paddling they have a basic understanding of a concept or skill. They are most able

to name, describe, following step-by-step instructions and prescriptive methods to complete a task. Once they are snorkelling they are working at a more advanced level. They are able to use their learning to solve problems and are able to explain their methods. At the deepest level of understanding the children are diving. They can solve non-routine problems using their learning, appraising their success, explaining concepts and hypothesising. At a basic level, 2 + 2 = 2 is a paddling question. This becomes a snorkelling question if the maths is required to solve a problem, for example, 'Jack has 2 cats and Jill has 2 dogs. How many pets do they have altogether?' or if it needs to be applied in a different way, eg, 4 - 2 = 2. At a mastery (or diving level) a child might be asked, 2 + 2 = 4. How many different possibilities can you find? We talk openly to the children about whether or not the tasks they are completing are asking them to paddle, snorkel or dive and actively encourage them to think about the depth of questions that they are asked, or ask of others. Why not try having a go at home? Perhaps you could apply this to the questions that you ask your child when they are reading to you and even ask them to grade the level of your questioning! If you would like to find out more about Paddling, Snorkelling and Diving please ask your child's class teacher.

This is the time I plan for responding to marking, target specific learning that the children require or pre-teach children that I feel will benefit from a booster before a lesson commences. It is a vital part of the teaching day so please ensure your child is in school ready to learn at 8.45am.

Class News - Oaks

At the moment we are focusing on formal written methods and mental strategies to solve number calculations. It has been recently announced that there will be a times table test at the end of year 4 so it is very important that the children are learning all of their times tables. Each week we will complete a Mathsmagician Times Table quiz and the children will have the opportunity to earn certificates for each level they reach.

This week in English we have focused on figurative language and the effect that it has in writing. We are thoroughly enjoying this and the children have generated some cracking similes and metaphors J.

In science we are continuing to investigate living things. We have moved onto the process of pollination and the role that plants and other living things have in this process.

On Wednesday the children were given the opportunity to visit the local cinema to see the latest version of Swallows and Amazons, which is based in the 1930s. After the film, Oaks became movie critics producing a critique of the film and a poster explaining what they had learnt about life between the two world wars. They have all given some great reviews and made links to what they knew and what they now know about life in the early 1900s. I wish I had seen it.


