LAST DAY OF TERM

The last day of term is Friday 27th July as stated on our school term dates and holiday calendar. Unfortunately, the wrong date (Thursday 26th July) was given on our termly calendar of events – wishful thinking on my behalf! If you have already made arrangements for Friday 27th July please advise Jacqui, Mel or Vikki and we will ensure that your child's absence is authorised. The Leavers' Service for Parracombe children will remain on Thursday 26th July and, subject to confirmation, it is now likely that the Lynton Leavers' Service will be on Wednesday 25th July to enable all of the Lynton Year 6 children to attend. Sarah Adams Lemon will be in touch with the Lynton Y6 parents individually to ensure that the new date/time is convenient to all before confirming more widely.

LYNTON FENCE

I just wanted to update you on the replacement of the rear playground fence. Work was scheduled to start this week but has been delayed again until the second week of July. We are currently in the final stages of negotiation with the Lynton & Lynmouth Town Council and North Devon District Council to secure a small area of Bottom Meadow Car Park to enable us to remove the current dog-leg in the fence. This will provide our Reception children with a larger enclosed area and will also give us a full-sized level court area within the rear playground to enable football, tag-ruby, basketball, netball, etc, to be taught and played more easily. I apologise for the further delay in replacing the fencing but we really didn't want to miss out on the opportunity of significantly improving our outdoor space for the sake of waiting a few more weeks. I would like to take this opportunity of thanking Sarah Adams Lemon who has been instrumental in moving this initiative forward and also the Lynton & Lynton Town Council and North Devon District Council who have been so supportive and eager to help us

facilitate these improvements. At the time the damage to our fence was far from ideal but it really is very exciting to think that something so positive may now have come of it.

SIHLANGU UPDATE

We have just received an update about Sihlangu, the boy who we have supported for a number of years through Challenge Ministries, Swaziland. As you may already know, Sihlangu arrived at Hawane Children's Home on the 1 January 2006, aged just 4, following the death of his parents. He has three brothers and two half-sisters. Sihlangu's name means 'protection or shield'. He now lives in a 'family-style' home with other children and is looked after by house parents. He attends Bulembu Christian Academy which offers an international-calibre education. He also has access to numerous clubs and after-school activities; all of which is possible due to the work of Challenge Ministries. Over the last term, Sihlangu has continued to do well at school. He has a particular aptitude for science, maths and social studies. He has recently enjoyed taking part in his school's sports day. His teacher reports that he is an extremely well behaved boy and a pleasure to teach. However, he could do with putting a little more effort into those areas of the curriculum that he finds less enjoyable!



KENTISBURY STAFFING

Sally Pile has now been signed off from work until the end of the academic year. However, she is hoping to be able to be able to make some short visits to school before the end of term. Lisa Hamer will continue to cover Sally's absence.

ENTERPRISE CHALLENGE

On Monday, each child within the federation will be loaned 50p and tasked with making it grow as much as possible over a four week period. On Monday 9th July children should return their 50p, together with any profit that they have made. If they make at least 100% profit they will be able to keep the initial loan. The children can work independently or join forces with siblings and friends to 'pool' money and engage in a larger enterprise scheme. Suggested activities could include baking cakes or biscuits to sell; buying the materials to clean cars for a small charge; making ice-lollies to sell; making and selling craft items; setting up a shoe shine business; making lemonade; selling art work; running a garage sale; in fact, anything at all so long as it is safe and supported by an adult. During the course of the four weeks, any money made can be reinvested into the 'business', but any left-over stock will not be counted within the profit at the end of the project. As well as giving the children the opportunity to develop their financial numeracy, money raised from this challenge will go towards our continued support of Sihlangu.
