Thank you so much for your understanding regarding the closure on Friday; it's always such a difficult decision to take, especially when the conditions vary so much within just a few miles, but ultimately the safety of our children and staff must come first.

## BOOK FAIR

Thank you so much for supporting our Book Fair so enthusiastically this year. Our children certainly enjoyed pursuing an excellent selection of fiction and non-fiction books and it was lovely to hear so many animated discussions about favourite books, authors and genres. In total we took just over £750 which has, in turn, enabled us to add the same value of stock to our school libraries. This would not have been possible without support and of which we are all very appreciative.

## BOOK BAGS

As a federation we are extremely proud of the importance that we place upon reading and we expect all of our children to read at home on a daily basis. This only needs to be for a few minutes each day and even our older and more advanced readers should be encouraged to read aloud on a daily basis and given the opportunity to talk about the books that they are reading. In order to keep books safe, could you please ensure that your child has an appropriate bag within which to carry their book and reading diary to and from school. Our federation book bags are ideal for this, but any other suitable bag is equally acceptable.

## SAFER INTERNET DAY – 5<sup>TH</sup> FEBRUARY

On Tuesday we will be marking Safer Internet Day with a range of activities across the federation. The aim of Safer Internet Day is to inspire a national conversation about using technology responsibly, respectfully, critically and creatively. Coordinated in the UK by the UK Safer Internet Centre, in partnership with Childnet International, Internet Watch Foundation (IWF) and the South West Grid for Learning (SWGfL), the celebration sees hundreds of organisations get involved to help promote the safe, responsible and positive use of digital technology for children and young people. This year in the UK, Safer Internet Day will focus on how consent works in an online context and our children will be exploring how they ask, give, and receive consent online, including how they take and share images and videos and how they manage their privacy and data. Our children will also explore how the internet works, who owns the information that is shared on it, and how they can actively take ownership of digital spaces. You can find out more by visiting:

We are also sending home a copy of Digital Parenting which provides some excellent information on ensuring a positive digital-life balance, keeping children safe on social media, setting digital boundaries, how to use technology as a family, how digital technology can impact upon sleep and, finally, what to do in the event of your child accessing unsuitable online content or using technology inappropriately.

## ATTENDANCE

Improving attendance levels across the federation continues to be an on-going challenge for us. The Local Authority are paying close attention to absence levels and, in particular, those children who are identified as being persistently absent (attendance of less than 90%). With this in mind, I thought it prudent to remind you that a request for absence in order to go only holiday can only be agreed in exceptional circumstances and that only one period of exceptional absence can be approved per academic year. Furthermore, an exceptional absence will only usually be approved if general attendance is at 95% or above. Individual attendance rates are monitored on a half-termly basis and if your child's attendance falls below 95% you will be notified and encouraged to work with us to improve their attendance rate. ## TIME KEEPING

A growing number of children are either arriving at school early or being collected late at the end of the school day. Children should not arrive at school until 8.30am in the morning and should be collected at the end of the day at 3.15pm as general supervision is not provided outside of these times. We provide breakfast clubs at each school within the federation so if you need to drop your child off before 8.35am please use this facility. Equally, if you require child care at the end of the day, clubs are available. Children not collected at the end of the day will be put into clubs (where space allows) and you may be charged for this. Thank you for your cooperation regarding this matter.

## AFTERSCHOOL CLUBS

In recent weeks, a number of children have been asking to phone home mid-afternoon as they do not wish to attend their chosen afterschool club. This is not only time-consuming for my admin team but also makes it difficult for those who are running clubs to plan appropriately. Also, with some of our clubs being over-subscribed, it means that some children are not able to attend their preferred club even though it is not actually full to capacity. Therefore, unless your child is poorly, we will be dissuading them from changing their agreed arrangements and would be grateful if you could reinforce this with your children. Thank you.

## HEADLICE AND THREAD WORM

Once again we have a number of reported cases of both headlice and thread worm within the federation. Could you please check your child and treat accordingly? 
**In collective worship we have been thinking about creation. We have been celebrating the many wonders of our world and thinking about what kind of world we are helping to create.**

## Reception, Year 1 & 2 – Streams & Young Buds

Streams and Young Buds have been learning about the effects of plastic in the ocean. It has been brilliant to see the children (and adults) take a real interest in how they can make a difference in the fight against pollution.

You could help your children at home by encouraging them to consider the types of materials, the properties of the materials, extending vocabulary to describe the material and by considering different ways in which it can be sorted eg. Shape, size, description, colour.

In English, the children have been continuing to write their explanation of how plastic is getting in the ocean and what effect it is having. In the next few weeks, we will be learning about conjunctions such as because, but, so and 'and'.



In maths, we will be continuing to learn about money. The children will be moving onto from recognising and adding coins to identifying the correct change. Please practice this at home and when out and about at the shops. Saplings have finished their block on shape and are now looking at place value to 20.

The home learning tasks have now been sent out. Please bring any completed tasks to school to present to the class. Please speak to your class teacher about when it would be a good time to do this.



We are really pleased to see the children using Mathletics more. We are able to see how the children are performing in the tasks and it has made an impact in their learning at school. Please check Mathletics for homework related to their current topics which will support their learning.

Could we please remind you that all children need PE kits in school. The children are taking parts in 2 sessions of PE each week and if they are not in the correct kit, it means there is a chance that they won't be able to take part.

### Year 3 & 4 - Rivers & Oaks

The last few weeks have been very busy for the children. In English, we have been focusing on persuasive writing, looking at how we can persuade people to reduce, reuse and recycle. Please can I encourage parents and children to research how plastic affects our environment as this will inform their English as well as Topic. In maths, the children are perfecting their multiplication and division skills using different methods. Can I ask that all children are practising their times tables as this will support their learning. Home learning tasks have been sent out which look very interesting! Have a look and see what you'd like to have a go at!

### Year 5 & 6 – Oceans and Forests
