# **REMEMBRANCE SERVICE**



At 11am on 11<sup>th</sup> November, our Key Stage 2 children marked Remembrance Day with a service at Woody Bay Train Station. The engine, Axe, provided the poignant backdrop for our service whilst our children read poems that that they had written about war and loss. As the Reveille broke our silence, our children placed poppy crosses into the garden of remembrance, many thinking about family members who served in the World Wars and subsequent wars around the world. As our service concluded, our children enjoyed a ride on the railway whilst contemplating the part that Axe played on the frontline and how the tranquillity of the Exmoor landscape today contrasts so greatly to the scenes of WWI that

they can only imagine. Thank you to everyone who joined us at this service, to Rev'd Samantha for leading service and to all at Woody Bay for enabling us to mark Remembrance in such a special way.

# PUNCTUALITY

I would like to remind all prents/carers that the school day starts promptly at 8.45am. Children should arrive at school in good time for the start of the school day. Arriving late is not only unsettling for your own child, but can delay the start of the day for the rest of their peers. Late arrivals will be recorded as such, which may have an impact upon your child's attendance record. If your child travels on one of our minibuses it is also vital that they are punctual. They should arrive at the collection point at least 5 minutes prior to the departure time of the bus to ensure that the minibus can pull away promptly at the agreed time. I have advised all minibus drives that they must leave on time and that stopping to pick up children who are late is not permissable. It is imperative that our buses run on time to ensure a prompt start to the day at both Parracombe and Kentisbury. Thank you for your support regarding this matter.

## Reception, Year 1 & Year 2 - Streams and Young Buds

We have had a very busy first two weeks back. It has been wonderful to welcome the children back and see them settling back into the routine.

In English, we are working on narrative, in particular, Fairy tales. The children will be exploring all things Fairy tales by listening to a range of traditional tales, acting out the stories, considering the key features and coming up with their own versions as the next few weeks progress. They will be looking at alternative versions to the traditional ones and even considering the tale from an alternative perspective.....who knew that the wolf might have been innocent all along?!





In Maths, the children are continuing with addition and subtraction. Please do continue to log in to Mathletics at home. The level of fluency that this supports within school is incredibly valuable. #### Year 3 & 4 - Rivers & Oaks

First of all, welcome back everyone. We hope you had a lovely break.

We would like to say a big well done to those children who took part in the Tarka Tennis Competition and the Cross Country and to MASSIVE well done to everyone for writing beautiful poems to read at our remembrance service at Woody Bay. You did great and represented the federation wonderfully.

I would just like to remind everyone that Rivers have PE on a Monday afternoon and a Friday afternoon and Oaks have PE on a Thursday morning. Since returning to school after half term we have been focussing on addition and subtraction, choosing appropriate strategies in order to solve problems efficiently. In our English lessons we have begun to explore explanation texts. Our end piece of writing will be an explanation text explaining the process of how or why an invention works.

# Year 5 & 6 - Oceans and Forests

# <u>English</u>

Since half term we have been focusing on our topic of poetry. We individually drafted and wrote poems that used personification and tried to enhance the range of vocabulary and figurative language we used within them. These poems formed the basis for our remembrance poetry for the service held at Woody Bay this week. Our poems were backed on special remembrance paintings we had created earlier in the week, to great effect.

#### <u>Maths</u>

We have recently finished our place value unit and will be moving onto Multiplication and Division. We know that we find long multiplication and division quite challenging so any additional work at home that could be done on this the better.

#### <u>Science</u>

This last week we have been learning about light travelling in straight lines. We have been introduced to a range of vocabulary and are starting to plan an experiment to investigate the changes in length of shadows.

# **Governor News**

#### Meet the Governors: Victoria Squire - Vice-Chair of Governors & Foundation Governor (Lynton)



I was brought up in Lynton, I am married to Robin and we have two daughters: Haven, who is currently at The Ilfracombe Academy, and Aura, who attends Lynton Church of England Primary School.

I am a graduate from Central Saint Martins College of Art with an MA in Communication Design and Oxford Brooks University with a Postgraduate Certificate in Education.

My teaching career began at South East Essex College, later moving to North Oxfordshire College and School of Art, before I returned to the area in 1997 as a lecturer at the University of Plymouth.

I have held a number of roles within the university: course leader for the BA Hons Graphic Communication with Typography programme; Subject Forum Chair for Arts (responsible for liaising between the Faculty of Arts and University of Plymouth Colleges Faculty which validates undergraduate and postgraduate courses in Colleges across the South West and Jersey, including Petroc locally); a harassment advisor; an external examiner for BA Hons Creative Industries at Southampton University.

After having Haven, I reduced my working hours, and I am currently a 0.6 lecturer on the BA Hons Graphic Communication with Typography programme and Partnership Coordinator for the School of Art, Design & Architecture. I also lead the 'Message' research group and I am a co-founder and co-editor of the Message Graphic Communication

Design Research Journal, published by the University of Plymouth Press. My research/design practice has been exhibited in the USA (most recently New York) and Denmark.

I joined the West Exmoor Federation as Foundation Governor in 2011 when Haven started at Lynton Primary School. Having a background in education, attending the school as a child, and with my two daughters being the fourth generation of our family to be educated at Lynton School, I wanted to be involved and contribute to the development of education provision for all children across the Federation.

Being a Foundation governor continues to be extremely rewarding as I endeavor to utilise my knowledge and skills in my roles as Vice Chair of Governors and Chair of the Ethos and Community Cohesion Committee. I am committed to developing the Ethos and Christian distinctiveness of the Federation and am passionate about actively supporting the Federation to achieve the very best education for all children.
