Dear Parents/Carers

How wonderful it has been to see our children out and about and enjoying some normality over the last few weeks. It's been incredibly busy with trips to Lynmouth to learn about the Lynmouth Flood; Year 3/4 enjoying a fabulous residential at Lee Abbey and the first of our three trips to Lyme Regis taking place. Next week there is another trip to Lyme Regis and our Y5/6 children will also enjoy their camping experience. When out, our children have been an absolute credit to themselves, you and the federation – I'm am so very proud of each and every one of them.

#### **CARIS**

This half term we are thinking about our CARIS value of support. We have revisited the story of the Good Samaritan and the children have been tasked with thinking about whether or not you need to know and/or like someone in order to help them. The children have also been drawing upon their own experiences, within and outside of school, to identify support in action and we have started to think about how supporting others enables us to grow as individuals. If you have some good examples of your children being supportive at home, please do share them with us.

#### **NEWSLETTERS**

During the course of the pandemic, the way in which we have used Class DoJo has changed significantly. Class DoJo has become the main way in which we share immediate information and/or reminders and also celebrate the wonderful things that are taking place across the federation. As a consequence, the purpose of our newsletter has somewhat shifted and is no longer our main means of communication. With this in mind, newsletters will now become monthly rather than fortnightly. Nearly all of our parents/carers are signed up to DoJo and using it on a regular basis. If you are not signed up, please do contact your child's class teacher and they can resend an invitation to you. If you are signed up, but do not receive notifications, please check both your app and phone settings, as it is possible that you have notifications turned off. If this fails, please try reinstalling the app.

## **COMMUNICATING WITH STAFF**

Throughout the pandemic channels of communication between parents/carers and staff have become quite informal. This has included staff providing personal mobile phone numbers, etc, to parents/carers in order to provide necessary support during these unprecedented times. As we begin to move towards a more normal way, on behalf of my staff, could I please request that remote communication is now limited to Class DoJo or email. Furthermore, to enable staff to enjoy quality time away from school, could I ask that DoJo messages and emails are only sent during normal working hours (Monday – Friday, 7.30am – 5.30pm, term time only). I do appreciate that sometimes evenings or weekends are the best time for parents/carers to send messages to staff. However, if this is the case, please messages via email and use scheduled send to ensure an appropriate delivery time. All of the federation staff are exceptionally conscientious and will check emails and DoJo messages out of hours but, by using schedule send, you will enable them to suitably recharge their batteries and enjoy some uninterrupted family time. Many thanks for your cooperation regarding this matter.

## COVID-19 UPDATE

With covid-19 cases rising within the locality it is essential that we remain vigilant to ensure that our children and communities remain as covid secure as possible. If your child has one of the three formally recognised symptoms of covid-19 (new persistent cough, high temperature, loss in taste and/or smell) please ensure that, as a household, you isolate whilst arranging a PCR test for your child. So long as the test result is negative, you may cease isolating and your child can return to school as soon as they are well again. If your child has any other symptoms widely recognised as being associated with covid-19, especially in children, eg, sore throat, headache, tummy ache, etc, please keep them at home (even if you consider them well enough to attend school) and carry out a lateral flow test (LFT). If the test is negative they can return to school immediately; if it is positive, please notify us and arrange for your child to have a PCR test. LFT Test Kits can be collected from the chemists in Lynton or Combe Martin and from several other locations in Barnstaple and Ilfracombe. LFT Kits can also be ordered for home delivery. ## Reception, Year 1 & Year 2 - Raindrops, Streams, Saplings and Young Buds

A very warm welcome back to school after the wonderful, sunny half term break. The children have come back raring to go which has been wonderful to see.

Over the next couple of weeks, Raindrops will be learning about number bonds to 10 in Maths.

In English, Raindrops and Saplings have started to read 'Somebody Swallowed Stanley' and have begun to think about how rubbish ends up in the ocean. The children will be using this in Literacy, where they will sequence the story and begin to write their own versions, based on the original.

As a result of the discussion we had earlier in the week, Raindrops decided that they would like to do a litter pick around the local area. Saplings, Streams and Raindrops are also learning about Rivers within Theme, alongside a historical focus on the Lynmouth flood.

Raindrops have spent the last few weeks observing some tadpoles in their classroom; some of them have grown their back legs and we now have one that has front legs as well! When they are ready, Raindrops will be releasing some of these into the pond in the new Forest School area in Lynton!





All of Key stage 1 had a fantastic morning running to raise money for Race for Life. The children were absolutely amazing and really got into the spirit of the run with some of them running 5km and even 10km! Thank you for all of your support.





Finally, just a reminder regarding applying sun cream to your child before school on sunny days; please do this at home prior to your child coming into school. ## **Key Stage Two**

## Lower KS2 - Young Buds, Oceans and Rivers

This side of half term, we will be studying the tragic Lynmouth flood of 1952. To start of this topic, Rivers took a trip down into Lynmouth to visit the Flood Memorial Hall. There we were able to see pictures, newspaper reports and witness accounts to retrieve facts and information to help us begin writing our newspaper reports.

In Maths, we have to started to look at fractions. What is a fraction? Identifying fractions and applying our understanding to answer questions. Please can I remind you to practice the times tables with your children at home. Fractions encompass many of the same skills as multiplication and division, therefore practicing at home would only benefit their learning further.

## Upper KS2 - Oceans and Forests

What a busy half term so far! We have only been back a week or so but yet we have achieved so much already! We are beginning to look at fractions in maths which require a solid understanding of times tables. Keep practising them as well as the inverse (multiplying and dividing). Games like times table bingo and Mathletics are great resources. Year 5/6 are finishing the subject of 'Changes of Materials' the learning about the historical event of the Lynmouth Flood. Each class will visit Lynmouth for a hands-on experience. Mr Mackenzie and myself are looking forward to the residential. The activities will be a wonderful opportunity for the children to build on their teamwork skills as well as themselves. Parracombe year 5/6 will erect the tents prior to the residential...let's hope they remember which way round the tent cover goes!

#### Wrights Care Farm Project

We would like to introduce you to Wrights Care Farm Project. We are a family run farm that made the decision last year to turn our farm into a therapeutic day centre here in Kentisbury, North Devon. Nestled on the edge of Exmoor national park we have 130 acres of organic grassland and a wildlife corridor throughout the farm teeming with buzzards, wild orchids, waterfalls, trees and wild animals.

Here are some of the activities on offer as part of our therapeutic days out:

Animal husbandry, animal therapy, close and personal contact with the animals. Gardening skills with our own polytunnel to grow your own vegetables, and then cook and eat them alongside our wood fired pizza oven. Bush craft and other great outdoors skills such as fencing, and tree maintenance in our very own apple orchard. Specialist projects working with motor

bikes and tractors tailored to individuals' needs. Picnics and overnight camping watching the stars in the dark skies of Exmoor.

Parts of the farm are accessible to wheel chair users and disabled toilet facilities are also available on site.

Our overall aim is to provide opportunities to people to gain life skills and a sense of wellbeing and joy! We are delighted to be working alongside Blanching Out Respite Care on a regular weekly basis.
